The Philip M. Epstein Award for Excellence in Family Law

Details and Terms of Reference:

In memory and honour of Philip M. Epstein, and sponsored by his family, the *Philip M. Epstein Award* for *Excellence in Family Law*, will be awarded at least every two years to a family law lawyer in Canada who has, during their legal career, demonstrated any of the following:

- 1. Contributions to the advancement of family law in their jurisdiction and/or across Canada.
- 2. Contributions to family law education for the bar and bench in their jurisdiction and/or across Canada.
- 3. Facilitating access to justice through *pro bono* and public service, including public interest litigation, in relation to family law-related matters.
- 4. Mentoring of and encouraging professional development of family lawyers and/or law students.
- 5. Fostering, by example and otherwise, civility and collegiality within the practice of family law and the family law bar.
- 6. Education of the public, law students, lawyers, and the judiciary about family law.
- 7. A commitment to excellence and distinction in family law litigation and/or dispute resolution in family law.
- 8. The initiation and pursuit of law reform related to the field of family law.

The Award may not be granted in a given year if no suitable nominations are received.

Award:

The Award comprises:

- (a) a cash award of \$10,000; and
- (b) registration for the next National Family Law Program a program near and dear to Phil's heart.



Eligibility:

Candidates must be:

- 1. a member in good standing of a Provincial law society; and
- 2. be primarily engaged in the practice of family law or dispute resolution in family law.

Nomination Process:

- 1. The deadline for nominations is June 30th, 2024, and every second year thereafter (even-numbered years) unless otherwise publicized.
- 2. Nominations are to be submitted electronically to the Managing Partner at Epstein Cole LLP.
- 3. Only complete nomination packages will be considered and must include:
 - (a) A Letter of Nomination by a third party with reference to the above-noted criteria;
 - (b) The nominee's curriculum vitae;
 - (c) A letter from the nominee of no more than 2 pages; and
 - (d) A maximum of five additional letters in support of the nominee with reference to the abovenoted criteria.
- 4. The Award will be administered by Epstein Cole LLP and the Selection Committee will be comprised of five people to include:
 - (a) A current member of the National Family Law Program Committee;
 - (b) The Managing Partner or most senior partner (by year of call) at the law firm of Epstein Cole LLP;
 - (c) Aaron M. Franks or such other representative of Philip Epstein's family as his family may nominate; and
 - (d) Two other members selected by the other committee members, one of whom may be a partner at Epstein Cole LLP.
- 5. No lawyer who is currently at Epstein Cole LLP is eligible for the Award.
